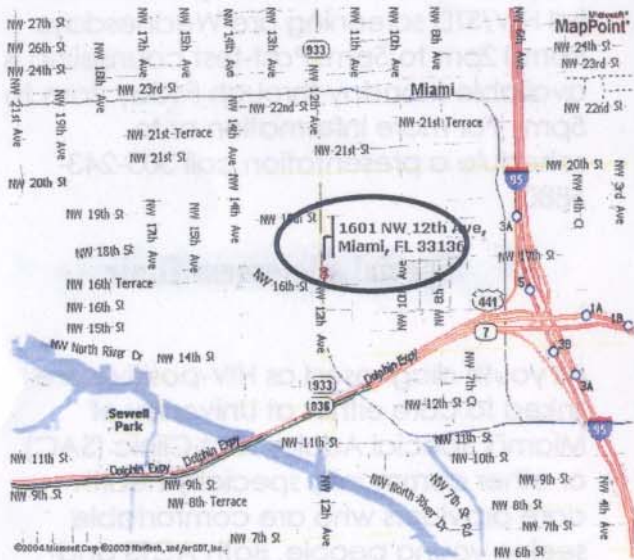

## About Promote to Prevent

The Promote to Prevent (**P2P**) Program was established by the Division of Adolescent Medicine at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine for youth 13-24 years of age who are in need of HIV and STD counseling, testing and treatment.



**P2P** delivers primary attention to youth infected with HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases. Our Health Department certified counselors are experienced and offer confidential service in a youth-friendly environment that does not require parental consent or involvement.



**P2P** is the only program in Miami that offers free anonymous and confidential HIV testing and STD screening and treatment for youth and young adults ages 13-24.

- Confidential HIV Testing
- Confidential STD Testing
- Free Medical Treatment Available
- Free Male & Female Condoms
- Free Pregnancy Testing

## STD Screening & Treatment

Through **P2P** you can get tested for syphilis, gonorrhea and chlamydia. If you have one of these common STDs we may be able to treat you for free.

Our staff will also be able to discuss tests, treatments and identify other STDs. Sometimes referrals may be necessary.

## Education & Outreach

The Division of Adolescent Medicine's **P2P** Outreach & Education Program incorporates the **HELPIN'** series of workshops (Health Education & Life Protection Issues Now) to reach youth at community agencies through collaborative agreements with the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) and the local school's alternative education sites serving at-risk youth ages 13-24. Educational programs can be offered on-site.

Youth are either offered immediate HIV and STD screening at the community facility or linked to counseling and testing at the Division's ACTS, (Adolescent Counseling and Testing Site), at UM/JM. Hours of operation for full HIV/STD screening are Wednesdays from 12pm to 5pm. Post-test counseling is available Monday through Friday 9am to 5pm. ## Special Adolescent Clinic

All youth diagnosed as HIV-positive are linked to care either at University of Miami's Special Adolescent Clinic (SAC) or other community specialty health care providers who are comfortable seeing young people. Both ACTS and SAC are housed in the same building, and staff from both programs work under the same medical director. ACTS counselors work with the social work team and medical staff on transitioning a newly diagnosed patient to SAC, and all staff collaborate on mandatory federal data reporting.
